Pittsfield Town Budget Committee positions available. There are currently 3 openings on the Budget Committee. If you are interested in participating in this important part of our town's financial planning, please contact Moderator Jackson Marston/ or Town Clerk/Tax Collector.

Pittsfield Town CIP Committee. (Capital Improvement Planning Committee.) The CIP committee analyzes the needs of the public capital assets of the town and school and puts together a schedule of improvements over time to effectively manage capital expenditures. The committee meets in September & October, every Monday at 6pm, and works with the town departments and committees and school officials to update the annual CIP plan for submission to the selectmen and budget committee. If interested, fill out a volunteer application form on the website (www.pittsfieldnh.gov) or at Town Hall, and return to Town Administrator Marston.

The Dorcas Guild of the First Congregational Church has adopted a community project that provides children with food to get them through the weekend. If you haven't already heard, the Victory Workers 4H Club is temporarily taking over the plastic collection from PES PTO. If you're not familiar with the NexTrex recycling program, it's a program where schools and non-profits are challenged to gather 1,000 pounds of recyclable plastics, weigh them, upload the tallies online, turn them in to local retailers and hopefully receive a free bench if the goal is reached within a 12 month period. The Pittsfield Community has been supporting this recycling endeavor since February for PES PTO, and they've already collected their 1,000 pounds, so jumping into this project was quite simple for us—but we're still asking for the community's help. There are large collection bins for the plastic at Danis Supermarket, Bell Brothers Convenience Store, Pittsfield Elementary School, Pittsfield Middle High School, Josiah Carpenter Library, and now at the Dowboro Farm Farmstand. As a result of the project having a presence here in Pittsfield, our 4-H group has already collected and turned in OVER ONE HUNDRED POUNDS OF PLASTIC this month!



Cooks Corner-- Fresh Apple Cake

It's finally apple season and we have some treats for you! This year, Pittsfield's Leavitt's Cider Mill will celebrate 95 years of operation. In 1980, to mark the 50th anniversary of the mill, a cookbook was published. Laurie Houle kindly offered to let us borrow it. The book is loaded

with lots of tasty recipes, most are baked goods and pies. Unfortunately no names were published, so we don't know who developed these recipes. As the first shared recipe, we feature the delicious Fresh Apple Cake. We'll have another one for you in the next issue of the *Post*. Enjoy! *MP Christakos*

1 & ½ cups all purpose flour

2 tsp baking soda

½ tsp salt

1 tsp ground cinnamon

1 tsp ground nutmeg

½ cup butter, softened

1 cup sugar

2 eggs

4 cups finely chopped apples, cored and peeled

1 cup Kellogg's All-Bran cereal or Kellogg's Bran Buds cereal

3 oz cream cheese, softened

1 TBSP butter, softened

1 tsp vanilla extract

1 & ½ cups sifted confectioner's sugar



Heat oven to 350. Stir together flour, baking soda, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg. In a separate bowl, beat the ½ cup of butter and sugar. Beat in the eggs. Stir in the apples, then the cereal, then the flour mixture.

Spread the batter into a 9x9 inch baking dish. Bake for about 45 minutes or until done.

To make the frosting, beat cream cheese, the 1 TBSP butter and the vanilla extract until very smooth. Gradually add the confectioner's sugar, beating until incorporated and smooth. If the frosting is too thick, add 1 to 2 tsp of milk. Spread the frosting on the cake, once it has completely cooled.
