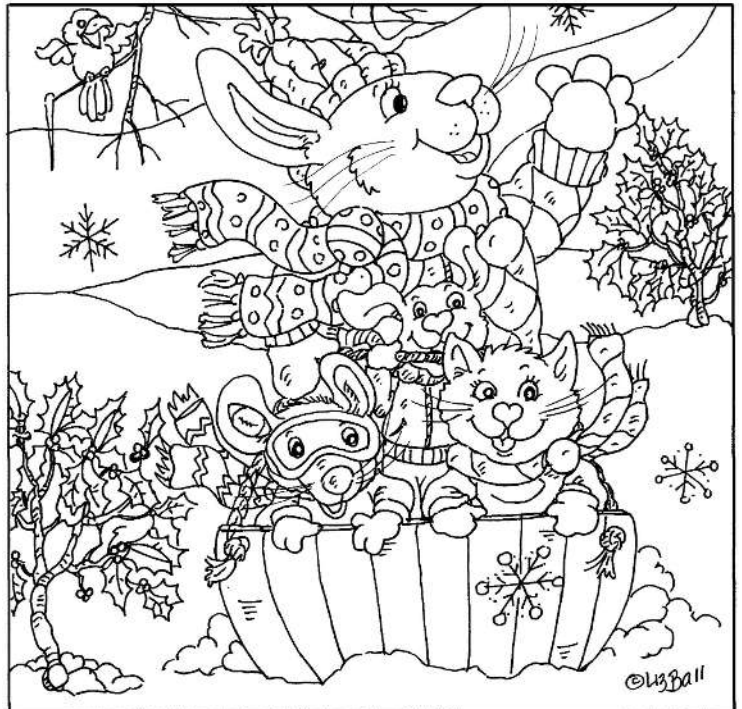

The Nex Trex plastic recycling program will continue in our community and the **South Pittsfield Community Club** is taking over the project next. If you're not familiar with the NexTrex recycling program, it's a program where schools and non-profits are challenged to gather 1,000 pounds of recyclable plastics, weigh them, upload the tallies online, turn them in to local retailers and "hopefully" receive a free bench if the goal is reached within a 12 month period! ****Acceptable items**** Acceptable plastics for this challenge include plastic grocery bags, bread bags, bubble wrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ziploc and other recloseable food storage bags, cereal bags, case overlap (such as case of bottled water), rock salt bags, pallet wrap, wood pellet bags and produce bags. Empty bags only. ****Unacceptable items**** Frozen food bags, chips bags, candy bar wrappers, net/mesh produce bags, pet food bags, pre-washed salad bags, hot dog or meat wrapping, six pack rings, PPE (gloves, masks). Drop-off locations: Bell Brothers Store, Danis Supermarket, Josiah Carpenter Library, Pittsfield Elementary School, Pittsfield Middle High School, Dowboro Farm Farmstand, and Clark's Grain Store.

Cook's Corner - Pizza Ring

Here's a delightful dish that's sure to please your family and guests over the holidays. This pizza "wreath" is easy to assemble and the kiddos will have fun helping. You can serve this as an appetizer or just add a nice big salad to make a full meal. Sending you all my very best wishes for a happy holiday season! Bon appetit! *MP Christakos*

- 1 lb bulk sausage
- 1 can (15 oz) pizza sauce, divided
- 1 & ½ cups shredded Mozzarella cheese, divided
- 4 oz Canadian bacon, OR pepperoni, chopped
- 2 tubes (8 oz each) refrigerated crescent rolls

Cook sausage in a large skillet over medium heat until no longer pink, breaking it into crumbles. Drain the meat, return to the skillet and stir in ½ cup of pizza sauce, 1 cup shredded cheese and the Canadian bacon or pepperoni.

Unroll crescent dough and separate into triangles. On an ungreased, 14-inch round pizza pan, arrange the triangles in a ring with the pointed ends toward the outside and the wide ends overlapping toward the center — leaving a 4 inch round opening in the center. Press the overlapping dough to seal.

Spoon meat filling onto the wide ends of the dough triangles. Fold pointed ends of the triangles over the filling, tucking points under to form a ring (filling will be visible).

Bake at 375 for 12 to 15 minutes, or until golden brown and heated through. Sprinkle the top with remaining cheese. Bake an additional 5 minutes or until cheese is melted.

Serve with remaining pizza sauce in a dish placed in the center opening of the pizza ring.

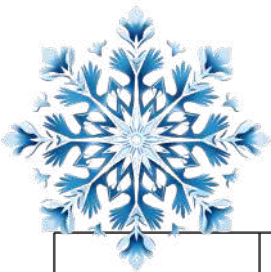

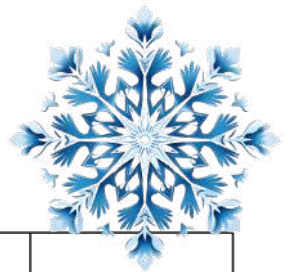
