





### Cooks Corner-Apple Walnut Drop Cookies

We hope you enjoyed the Fresh Apple Cake recipe we offered in the last issue of the Post. Here we have another goodie from the Leavitt's Cider Mill 50th Anniversary Cookbook (published in 1980). These cookies are fantastic with a cup of hot tea or coffee. Bon appetit! *MP Christakos* 

3 cups all purpose flour

1 & ½ tsp baking soda

34 cup soft shortening, such as Crisco

2 cups light brown sugar, packed

34 tsp salt

1 & ½ tsp ground cinnamon

1 & ½ tsp ground cloves

34 tsp ground nutmeg

2 eggs, do not beat

1 & ½ cups chopped walnuts

1 & ½ cups finely chopped apples, cored, seeded and sliced, but do not peel

1 & ½ cups raisins, chopped

½ cup apple juice, apple cider or milk

Heat oven to 400. Lightly grease several baking sheets. Sift the flour with the baking soda. In a separate bowl, mix the shortening, brown sugar, salt, cinnamon, cloves, nutmeg and the eggs until well blended. Stir in half of the flour mixture, then the nuts, apples and raisins. Blend in apple juice (or cider or milk, if using) until the batter is well combined. Now add the remaining flour mixture and stir well.

Drop rounded tablespoons of the dough onto the baking sheets, placing them 2 inches apart. Bake for 11 to 14 minutes, or until done.

While the cookies are still hot, spread thinly with the glaze (see below). Decorate with bits of apple, if desired.

#### For the glaze

2 cups sifted confetioner's sugar

1 & ½ TBSP butter, softened

½ tsp vanilla extract


¼ tsp salt

¼ cup milk

In a small bowl, combine all ingredients and mix well until smooth.


